Written Laws Keep Order. At first, none of the laws were written down. Some people didn't even know some laws existed. 450 BCE - Rome wrote down its first Code of Laws on 12 Tablets. Called the Law of the Twelve Tables. These tablets were displayed in the Forum. Forum - Rome's public meeting place. These laws helped maintain order in Rome.
